

Reading Colors Your World:

Stained Glass Sun Catcher

Supplies:

- +Plastic lid +Glass gems
- +Clear Glue +Yarn or ribbon
- 1. Place your lid on a flat surface, flat side down, rim edge up.
- 2. Pour enough glue into the lid so that it coats the entire lid bottom.
- 3. Arrange the gems on the lid, sticking them onto the glue.





- 4. Pour remaining glue over gems (optional).
- 5. This is the hard part WAIT. It will take 3-5 days to dry completely, depending on your

design and how much glue is used. It may help to place the lid up high and out of the way so you're not tempted to take it out too soon!

- 6. Once the glue has dried completely, it should peel away from the plastic lid easily. **If it still feels tacky, allow the sun catcher to continue drying.** We know, we know—this is so much waiting!
- 7. Using a pencil, toothpick, or other pointed object (you may need to ask your grownup for help), poke a hole in the dried glue near the outside edge.
- 8. Thread the yarn/cord through the hole and tie the ends.
- 9. Hang your sun catcher in a window and enjoy!
